

**Q1. IF I ACCEPT THE \$500 ADVANCE PAYMENT, DOES THAT PREVENT ME FROM RECEIVING A FUTURE SETTLEMENT PAYMENT?**

A. No. Every claimant in the Tolbert Qualified Settlement Fund is entitled to a \$500 Advance Payment. Your registering for the Advance Payment provides us with an updated claimant address and missing claimant information for some claimants, such as those without social security numbers. Receipt of the Advance Payment does not reduce in any way your rights to additional payments from the Settlement. However, if you do not register for the Advance Payment, you will not be able to receive any additional payments.

**Q2. I NOTE THAT ONE OF THE DEFENDANTS, SOLUTIA, IS IN CHAPTER 11 BANKRUPTCY. WILL THIS DELAY MY ADVANCE PAYMENT, OR OTHER POTENTIAL CLAIMANT PAYMENTS?**

A. No. We are continuing to pay all qualifying Advance Payments as quickly as possible and to collect claimant information necessary to determine what additional claimant payments are to be made.

**Q3. DOES MY BANKRUPTCY PREVENT MY OBTAINING A PAYMENT?**

A. Not necessarily. If you listed this case as an asset and you have been discharged, the bankruptcy may not affect your ability to be paid. However, if you did not list this case as an asset, your bankruptcy may impact your ability to receive a payment. When you tell us that you have been in bankruptcy, we will research this issue and let you know your status.

**Q4. I DO NOT HAVE A BANK ACCOUNT WITH AMSOUTH BANK. WILL THEY CASH MY ADVANCE PAYMENT CHECK?**

A. Yes. Report to the AmSouth Bank building in Anniston (the largest building in town), and they will gladly cash your Advance Payment check. There will be a banner above the tellers who have been assigned to this task.

**Q5. MY RELATIVE IS A CLAIMANT BUT SHE IS DECEASED. HOW DO I REGISTER FOR MY RELATIVE AND HOW WILL HER BENEFITS BE PAID?**

A. If a claimant is deceased, the administrator or executor of her estate may complete the Advance Payment Registration Form. This representative of the estate needs to attach a copy of the document from the Court appointing him, such as the letters of administration. The claimant benefit check, such as the Advance Payment, will then be made payable to the estate of the deceased claimant.

**Q6. I AM INTERESTED IN THE TWO QUALITY HEALTH CARE PRODUCTS TO BE PROVIDED BY PFIZER TO ALL CLAIMANTS. PLEASE TELL ME ABOUT THEM AND LET ME KNOW HOW I MAY OBTAIN MORE INFORMATION.**

A. The two programs are the Pfizer Sharing the Care Program, which donates leading medicines to the community, and the Pfizer for Living Card Program, which helps Medicare patients get a thirty day supply of Pfizer prescription medicines for a flat fee of \$15.00 per prescription. **Q7. I WAS NOT A PLAINTIFF IN THE TOLBERT OR OLIVER CASES. MAY I PARTICIPATE IN THIS SETTLEMENT?**

A. No. However, even if you were not a Plaintiff in the Oliver or Tolbert cases, you may be able to use the Medical Clinic that we are building and you may be eligible for the Pfizer Programs, described above.

**Q8. I ALREADY TOOK A PCB BLOOD TEST. WILL I HAVE TO TAKE IT TWICE?**

A. You may have to take your blood test a second time because the blood test to be used with the other Claimants may be different from the one you already had. If we do not test all Claimants with the same method, we may not be able to distinguish among Claimants fairly for purposes of paying Claimant benefits.

**Q9. THE CLAIMS ADMINISTRATOR DOES NOT SEEM TO HAVE ALL THE MEDICAL INFORMATION OR RECORDS THAT I PROVIDED TO MY ATTORNEY. WHAT MAY I DO ABOUT THIS?**

A. We will not require medical records unless we notify you differently.

**Q10. I HAVE PROVIDED THE CLAIMS ADMINISTRATOR WITH MY ADVANCE PAYMENT REGISTRATION FORM. WHAT ELSE WILL I HAVE TO DO TO QUALIFY FOR ADDITIONAL CLAIMANT BENEFITS FOR CLAIMED PERSONAL INJURY OR CLAIMED PROPERTY DAMAGE?**

A. To be eligible for possible additional personal injury payments, you will have to take the PCB blood test and be interviewed by a Registered Nurse on the day that you are tested if you live in Anniston, or by telephone if you do not. We will also be providing you with an additional personal injury claim form to complete in the near future.

If you wish to qualify for possible payments for property damage, you will be required to fill out the property damage claim form that we will provide you in the near future.

Please do not provide us with any medical records or property damage records unless we request them.

**Q11. WHY CAN'T MY ENTIRE CLAIM BE PAID NOW?**

- A. Before the Claims Administrator can determine how much to pay each Claimant, additional personal injury data needs to be gathered, such as the PCB blood test results, Registered Nurse interview disease results, and, to the extent you did not already provide it to your lawyer, information concerning how long and how close you lived or worked relative to the PCB Plant.

With respect to property damage, the Claims Administrator may have to determine the amount of remaining property damage after the land has been repaired by the Defendants prior to determining the fair amount due you for such damage. In addition, the Claims Administrator will ask you to confirm certain information concerning your property, such as its location and size, when you owned it, and so on.

Although much information needs to be gathered before additional claims can be paid, the Claims Administrator is moving as fast as possible to gather this information while administering your settlement as fairly as possible.
